LADIES SINGLES RULES

1. The Maryland State United States Bowling Congress Ladies Singles Championship Tournament is open to all women over age 18 who are USBC certified members of one of the following Local Maryland USBC Associations:

Cecil Harford USBC Association
Eastern Shore USBC Association
Greater Baltimore USBC Association
Mid-Maryland USBC Association
Western Maryland USBC Association

2. Entrants who are not a member of the MDUSBC can purchase an Associate membership for \$22.00 by the tournament entry closing date. Failure to meet criteria shall be cause for disqualification and forfeiture of all entry fees and any prize or awards.
3. Entrants may enter only once.
4. Handicap will be based on 90% of 220 with no maximum handicap.
5. **Average Requirement**
 - a) Entrant shall use their highest certified average established in any USBC certified league from the previous 2025-2026 season (winter and summer) based on 21 games or more.
 - b) If an entrant has no 2025-2026 USBC certified average, they must use their highest current USBC certified average for 21 games or more from any Association per USBC Rule 319a-1. In addition, entrant must furnish a league standing sheet with written verification from their league secretary as of the start of the tournament. USBC Rule 319a-2 (10 pin up rule) will not apply.
 - c) If eligibility Requirements are met and bowler doesn't meet the average requirements they will bowl scratch in the Diamond Division.
6. Entrants with an average of 150 & under will participate in the Sapphire Division, entrants with an average between 151 & 179 will participate in the Ruby Division and entrants with an average of 180 & above will participate in the Diamond Division.
7. Entrants will bowl within their average Division unless lane assignment is requested. Any entrant who requests to bowl with a specific individual will bowl on the lanes assigned to the lower average of the two or more participants. Lane requests must be submitted with application. Lane assignment requests will only be honored if lanes are available.
8. Use of electronic recording equipment is prohibited during competition. This includes but is not limited to live streaming and playing of music. Headphones are allowed as long as nobody can hear the music.

9. Entries close midnight November 23, 2026.
10. Entry number shall have precedent in scheduling in all cases where duplicate requests are received. Scheduling will be accomplished on a first come, first serve basis.
11. Check in will begin at least one hour before scheduled time to bowl. Entrant will provide a current USBC sanction card.
12. Each entrant will bowl a total of four games. Entrants will change lanes after the completion of two games. The four game total score including handicap will determine handicap winners.
13. Use of electronic recording equipment is prohibited during competition. This includes but is not limited to live streaming and playing of music. Headphones are allowed as long as nobody can hear the music.
14. Cash prizes in the tournament will be awarded in each of the events for Scratch and Handicap. Prize fund is to be paid out at a ratio of at least 1:8 with 80% of the money for handicap and 20% of the money for scratch.
15. The MDUSBC Association will pay up to 500.00 towards any USBC Sanctioned Women's National **SCRATCH** Tournament (US Open, Queens, Team USA Qualifying, Etc.) to the bowler with the highest scratch series. Any tournament not listed will need board approval.
16. If an individual should place first in both scratch and handicap divisions they will receive the titles and trophy for both divisions but only the highest cash award in either the scratch or handicap division.
17. **Entrants must comply with USBC Rule 319e (Average Adjustment for Entry) and USBC Rule 319d (Reporting Prior Prize Winnings).**
18. It shall be each entrant's responsibility to verify the accuracy of their average. Failure to use proper average shall disqualify scores if submitted average is lower than actual average. If you have been re-rated in the past 12 months, in any tournament, you must report rerating to the tournament manager in writing prior to squad time. Failure to report will result in disqualification.
19. Appropriate attire is required at the discretion of the tournament manager.
20. A \$25.00 fee will be charged for any checks returned by our bank for non-payment.
21. Tournament manager shall decide any questions not covered by these rules.
22. USBC Rules will prevail when not specifically covered in the above.
