Meritorious Service



Joseph W. Moore, II was born September 23, 1914. He became involved with the sport of tenpins during the 1930's. In 1942 he joined the oldest continuous bowling league in the country, the Drug Trade League in Baltimore. Joe remained a member of the league for 48 of its, then, 96 years of existence.

Joe's desire to get involved grew from league officer to board member of the GBBA, to cofounder and 1st president of the Maryland State Bowling Association in 1960. His many hours of dedication were duly honored initially in 1969 when he was elected as a Charter member

of the GBBA Hall of Fame.

Joe also is an executive life member of both the Greater Baltimore and the Maryland State Bowling Associations. The men's associations were not the only recipients of Joe's labor. For many years Joe was involved with the local AJBC youth bowling programs.

It is with great honor that the Maryland State Bowling Association selects Joseph Warren Moore, II as the inaugural inductee in the meritorious service category of the Maryland State Bowling Association Hall of Fame.
