Donald F. McMaster was born in Chicago, Illinois, the 5th of twelve children. Don now lives with his wife Wanda, in Baltimore. Don and Wanda have two children. Don served in the US Navy for eight years, achieving the rank of Chief Petty Officer.

Don has played an integral part in the formation of the Maryland State Bowling Association. He served as Secretary/Treasurer for eleven years. Don has also served the State as a Director and a delegate representing the GBBA. Don currently serves as a Life Member of the MSBA.

Don has been a member of the MSBA for over 40 years. He organized the first State Jamboree, serving as its chairman. Don was instrumental in organizing the State Junior Bowling Association, serving as the secretary for the first year.

Don played a very big part in the formation of the Maryland State Seniors Tournament. In 1982 he won the Seniors Doubles Championship with his partner, James Morrel.

On the local level, Don has served as the Chairman of the GBBA Hall of Fame for over twenty five years. He is a member of the Greater Baltimore Bowling Association Hall of Fame. Always conducting himself in a most dignified manner, Don has been a delegate to the ABC National Meeting, and represented GBBA on many occasions.

Don has bowled in thirty five consecutive MSBA championship Tournaments, and forty GBBA City Championship Tournaments.

Don is currently a member of the Drug Trade League of Baltimore, the oldest sanctioned league in the world. Don has bowled in this league for over forty years. He has knocked down more than 808,525 pins in 4,430 games, establishing a lifetime average of 182.

Donald F. McMaster has performed in an exemplary manner for both the local association and the Maryland State Bowling Association.

In recognition of his dedicated and meritorious service to the game of American Ten Pins, Donald F. McMaster is inducted into the Maryland State Bowling Association Hall of Fame.
