Chrissy continued bowling at many bowling centers in the area, but it was at Bowl America Dundalk where she her husband Brian. They were married in July 1991 and left for Germany in September. They lived in Germany for four years. Chrissy and Brian both worked at Rhein-Mein Air Base while in Germany. Luckily there was a bowling center on base. They joined a couple of leagues together. It was there that Chrissy qualified for the European Masters tournament held in southern Bavaria. This tournament was for all of the United States Military and Civilian personnel stationed throughout the European countries.
